



# DID YOU KNOW?

- ★ LSU's presence produced \$1.2 billion in direct and indirect sales during the 2008 fiscal year in the Baton Rouge Metropolitan Statistical Area.
- ★ LSU has produced a number of distinguished undergraduates, including four Marshall Scholars, 25 Goldwater Scholars, 14 Rhodes Scholars, five Truman Scholars, and 25 Fulbright Scholars.
- ★ In 2008, LSU was one of 68 U.S. public institutions to earn the prestigious Carnegie Community Engagement and Outreach classification based on community engagement, outreach, and partnerships.
- ★ Contract and grant awards from external sources for faculty research totaled \$140 million in 2007-08, most of which is spent in Louisiana.
- ★ In 2008, the LSU Office of Intellectual Property registered 46 invention disclosures and saw 17 patents issued to University researchers; since 1988, LSU has recorded a total of 269 patents issued and has received \$7,763,915 from licensing alone.


